## REVERE AND WINTHROP STREET CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Project goals are to provide infrastructure upgrades to improve roads, traffic signals and flow, drainage, utilities and lighting.

**Progress to Date:**  
Underground work 95% complete including reconstruction of drainage system, gas main replacement, installation of electrical conduit for traffic signals.

**Construction Schedule**  
Spring/Summer 2025  
• Roadway, traffic signal and sidewalk reconstruction (Main to Kennedy)  
Summer 2026 - Fall 2026  
• Roadway, traffic signal and sidewalk construction (Kennedy to Crest Ave)

**Work Hours and Traffic Impacts:**

- Monday - Friday 7:00 AM - 3:30 PM
- Maintain one lane of travel throughout construction. Two-way traffic maintained by alternating flow.
- No Lane closures on Kennedy Drive during school drop off/pick up

## Town of Winthrop Curbside Leaf-Green Waste Collection

**Saturday, June 14, 2025**



Capitol Waste will go throughout the entire Town for pickup. Compostable leaf bags/bagless leaf and green waste in a bin, must be on the curb by 7 am

### What is "Green Waste"?

Green waste includes grass, leaves, vines, hedge trimmings, and small to medium-sized branches. Root balls and branches over three inches are not accepted. Grass, leaves, vines, and hedge trimmings need to be in compostable brown bags or unbagged in a bin. It is essential that other wastes, such as rocks, plastic, construction material, trash, or animal waste do not mix with green waste.

## The Town of Winthrop Yard Waste Transfer Station Policies

*This facility is open for personal household use by Winthrop residents only.  
No access for commercial properties, landscaping companies,  
or contractors.*

- The drop-off of leaves and grass clippings is free of charge.
- Proof of residency is required. A current resident parking sticker or a valid driver's license is required to show proof of residency.
- Residential branch load tickets are available at the DPW Building located at 100 Kennedy Drive, Monday through Thursday, during regular business hours. The cost is \$20 per ticket. Check or money order only. Branch loads are not to exceed a pick-up truck bed. (5 yards maximum)
- Branches larger than 3 inches in diameter will not be accepted at the transfer station.
- Tree stumps, trash, stones, dirt, potted plants, and other debris are strictly prohibited.

### Deer Island Treatment Plant

MWRA's Deer Island Wastewater Treatment Plant is the centerpiece of MWRA's \$2.8 billion program to protect Boston Harbor against pollution from metropolitan Boston's sewer systems.

The plant removes human, household, commercial and industrial pollutants from wastewater that originates in homes and businesses in 43 communities. In compliance with all federal and state environmental standards and subject to the precedent setting discharge permit issued for the plant by EPA and DEP, its treated wastewater is released through a deep rock under harbor tunnel 9.5 miles out into Massachusetts Bay.



### Public Access


Deer Island features five miles of public walkways and trails for walking, jogging, sightseeing, picnicking, fishing and bicycling. The public access area is open to the public year-round, from sunrise to sunset. At Deer Island you'll also find:

- 60 acres of open space, including 24 miles of paved handicapped accessible perimeter path
- 10 landscaped overlooks with interpretive signage
- Dramatic views of the Boston skyline and Harbor Islands
- Spectacular close-up of airport landings and takeoffs
- Elevated look-in location to learn about the treatment plant
- An Irish Memorial honoring those that perished in the Great Hunger
- A new Fishing Pier with additional parking
- Low maintenance native plant species similar to those on other Harbor Islands



### Public Access Area Rules

Dog owners are reminded that dogs must be kept on a leash at all times and to clean up after their dogs. Mutt Mitts are available.

The Winthrop Dog Officer routinely patrols the area.

Alcoholic beverages, camping, open flames, motorized or self-propelled vehicles (except motorized wheelchairs) and skateboards are prohibited. At the present time, fishing is permitted along the shoreline of the Public Access area, as well as from the fishing pier.



### WALK OR RIDE

Visitors are asked to stay on trails and to stay off vegetated areas. Bicyclists are advised to wear a helmet, stay only on paved trails and to respect pedestrians. Bicyclists are reminded to be courteous, keep right and to not impede other trail users. There is no admittance to the fenced-off wastewater treatment facility without prior approval.

### Security

The Deer Island Public Access Area is patrolled regularly by MWRA. The Massachusetts State Police, Environmental Police and the Winthrop Police also patrol the area. In addition, the public access area is monitored by video cameras supported by a 24-hour command center. Emergency call boxes and additional cameras are installed around the park.

### How To Report An Issue Or An Odor Complaint

As Deer Island's closest neighbors, Winthrop residents are apt to notice anything unusual or odors that might be coming from the plant. The Deer Island Hotline is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Although our Certified Wastewater Treatment Plant Operators continuously monitor the treatment process and are trained to respond quickly to odor-producing problems, they need to hear from you. Visitors are encouraged to report anything out of the ordinary on public access to the Deer Island Hotline by telephone or email.



### Please Be Sure To:

- Call 911 if it is an emergency
- Report the issue or the odor as soon as possible
- Please include the location and time.
